

The First Step To Success In ECS is Mathematics

If you plan on attending Sacramento State in the fall, this test is an important first step in your college career!

Save **TIME** and **MONEY** by reducing your path to an engineering or computer science degree by up to **2** semesters. Get ahead of your college career by taking the math diagnostic exam at the open house! You will know your math placement the same day.

If you do NOT pass the exam, you will still have time to review and prepare yourself to take the exam again during the summer.

You should take the **Calculus Readiness Test (CR)** if you:

- are currently taking pre-calculus or calculus, OR
- have a passing AP calculus exam score

This is a 1.5 hour exam, no calculators.

You should take the **Intermediate Algebra Diagnostic Test (IAD)** if you:

- are currently taking algebra II or pre-calculus, AND
 - are getting a grade “C” or lower

This is a 1 hour exam, no calculators.
